#####

OMS:

The government has taken various measures to keep the prices of essentials stable in the market during the holy month of Ramadan.

Under the initiatives selling of rice in open market begins across the country from Wednesday.

The price of rice has been fixed at 28-taka per kilogram.

Each person may buy maximum three kilograms of rice a day.

Bangladesh Rifles has already launched its Daal-Bhat programme to feed the poor people throughout the country.

Selling of cereal began through two hundred ten fair price outlets including one hundred in and around the capital.

Meanwhile, Trading Corporation of Bangladesh-TCB has decided to import essential commodities on the occasion of the holy month.

TCB will import three thousand metric tons of lentil, equivalent quantity of soybean oil, five hundred metric tons of gram and two hundred metric tons of onion.

Besides, it has decided to buy sugar from the Bangladesh Sugar and Food Industries Corporation to sell it in open market.

The essentials will be sold through divisional level fair price shops including two in Dhaka.

Meanwhile, the government has decided to gear up monitoring activities to keep the prices of commodities under control.

Members of Joint Forces comprising RAB, BDR, Police and civil administration will take part in the monitoring activities.

#####

COLLEGE:

The government has decided to cancel age-based admission process at colleges in the country.

Education and Commerce Adviser Dr. Hossain Zillur Rahman said this in Dhaka yesterday.

He said, average numbers obtained by the students will be included in the mark sheet or transcript from next year and admission in colleges will be possible on their basis.

Meanwhile, college authorities have welcomed the decision of the government.

#####

WASA:

Dhaka Water and Sewerage Authority-WASA has undertaken a plan worth over eighty-one crore taka to supply an additional six crore liters of safe drinking water to the dwellers of Narayanganj.

Under the programme, twelve new deep tube-wells will be set up at different places of the town and five old deep tube-wells would be replaced by the new ones.

WASA will meet more than twelve percent of the total cost of the project while the rest of the amount would be met from Annual Development Programmes.

#####

RAJSHAHI :

Meanwhile, the department of Public Health and Engineering has been implementing a development project for ensuring easy access to safe water and sanitation facilities for the poor in the country's northern region.

The four-year project titled "Hygiene, Sanitation and Water Supply" is being executed in 2 hundred Unions under 25 Upazilas of Rajshahi, Naogaon and Chapainawabganj districts with an estimated cost of 266 crore taka.

Main objective of the project is to develop and demonstrate sustainable hygiene, sanitation and water supply service through local government institutions in consultation with community people.

On successful implementation, the project is expected to contribute to reducing poverty along with improving living standard of the people.

#####

GAS:

The government is considering to extract more gas than the present level from Bibiyana gas field.

At present, the state-run Petrobangla is taking around five hundred million cubic feet gas per day from the field to meet the growing demand for power generation and other purposes.

Official sources say, a technical committee is evaluating a third party assessment report, which found the gas reservoir size is bigger than was initially assumed.

If the Petrobangla is convinced with the report and finds it justified extracting more gas than the present level, then the US-based international oil company Chevron will be asked to produce more gas from the field.

The oil company also said that producing more than five hundred million cubic feet gas per day from Bibiyana gas field will not be harmful to the field's original reservoir.

#####

TRADE SHOW:

A 10-day Asian International Trade Expo-2008 began in Dhaka to display various products produced in the Asian country.

Additional Secretary of the Industries Ministry Elias Ahmed inaugurated the show at Bangladesh-China Friendship Conference Centre in Dhaka yesterday.

The show aims at creating opportunity of investment in the country as well as strengthening intra trade relations between the Asian counties.

Inaugurating the show Elias Ahmed said, the Exposition will help promote trade under one roof by creating awareness among the consumers about products of other countries and new technologies.

A total of one hundred 20 organisations of the seven Asian countries like Bangladesh, India, Japan, China, South Korea, Malaysia and Singapore are taking part in the exposition.

CHT-COFFEE:

Processed coffee produced in the Chittagong Hill Tracts will be available in the local markets within a very short time.

Reports say, raw coffee is being collected from the farmers at Chittagong Hill Tracts and distributed in the market after proper processing.

Coffee is being cultivated in the Chittagong Hill Tracts under Orange and Mixed Fruit Project with a view to alleviating poverty of the people living in the hilly region.

A total of four hundred coffee orchards have been raised in three hill districts since the project was launched in 1999.

#####

PAKISTAN:

President Pervez Mosharraaf will not resign even after Pakistan's coalition agreed a host of charges with which to impeach the former General.

Mosharraaf's spokesman said this decision yesterday.

Mosharraaf is holding out against intense pressure to resign from political foes who swept February elections and relegated the stalwart US ally to the sidelines.

Meanwhile, Pakistani ruling coalition government has asked President Pervez Musharraaf to resign within two days or face impeachment motion.

The ruling coalition finalized the charges to be launched against him if he refuses to resign.

A committee of coalition officials agreed on a list of impeachment charges against the President.

Defence Minister Ahmed Mukhtar categorically said, the charge sheet will be presented in parliament tomorrow.

#####

IRAQ:

A suicide bomber has killed at least 15 people and wounded 29 near a mosque in a mainly Sunni part of the Iraqi capital Baghdad.

Reports said, the attacker rode up on a motorcycle before setting off a bomb in the Adhamiya district.

The dead include Faruq al-Obeidi, a local leader of a US-backed Sunni militia fighting al-Qaeda in Iraq.

The bomber attacked as the militia leader sat with his bodyguards at a cafe and six guards died along with him.

#####

M E:

The Israeli cabinet has voted to release some 200 Palestinian prisoners as a goodwill gesture to Palestinian Authority leader Mahmoud Abbas.

Officials said the actual release would take place around 25 August, but the list of inmates is yet to be finalised.

Mr Abbas' aide described the move as a step in the right direction, but said more prisoners should be set free.

Israel is said to be holding between 8,500 and 11,000 Palestinian prisoners, including several hundred children.

ZIMBABWE:

Zimbabwe's ruling party and opposition have failed to reach a power-sharing agreement at a summit of Southern African leaders in Johannesburg.

But the Secretary-general of the opposition Movement for Democratic Change said, he believed a deal with the Zanu-PF would be reached very soon.

South African President Thabo Mbeki, who is mediating in the crisis.

The MDC is insisting President Robert Mugabe surrender his executive powers.

MDC leader Morgan Tsvangirai is said to have agreed in principle to take on a powerful Prime Ministerial role in a new national unity government, although the exact balance of power is undecided

#####

RUSSIA:

Russian President Dmitry Medvedev has said, forces will begin withdrawing from Georgia today.

Mr Medvedev made the pledge in a telephone call to French President Nicolas Sarkozy, who brokered a Russian-Georgian ceasefire agreement.

Earlier, the Russian commander of frontline forces in Georgia told the BBC a gradual withdrawal of Russian forces is under way.

Russian troops went into Georgia after fighting erupted over South Ossetia.

Major General Vyacheslav Borisov said, he had given the order for Russian soldiers in the village of Igoeti, about 32km from the Georgian capital, Tbilisi, to be replaced by Russian peacekeepers.

But National Security Council Secretary Alexander Lomaia dismissed the move.

But he says Russian soldiers still control the town's key entry and exit points.

The Russian commander in Gori says his troops are staying to prevent looting and will leave when Georgian police are ready to take over.

#####

OLYMPIC:

US Superstar swimmer Michael Phelps has set a rare record written becoming the first ever athlete to win eight gold medals at a single Olympic games.

The record was set after he won the men's 400-metre medley relay in the 29<sup>th</sup> Summer Olympic on its 9<sup>th</sup> day in Beijing yesterday.

The previous record was set up by another American swimmer Mark Spitz capturing seven gold at Munich Olympics in 1972.

Meanwhile, China is maintaining its top position in the 29<sup>th</sup> Beijing Summer Olympic with 35 gold, 13 silver and 13 bronze medals.

The United States is holding the second place with 19 gold, 21 silver and 25 bronze medals, while Britain is in the third place with 11 Golds, 6 silver, 8 bronzes.

Prime Minister Gordon Brown hailed the unprecedented success of Britain's athletes in a statement released by Downing Street yesterday.

In Tennis, Rafael Nadal at first times won gold medal for Spain in Men's single of Olympic.
